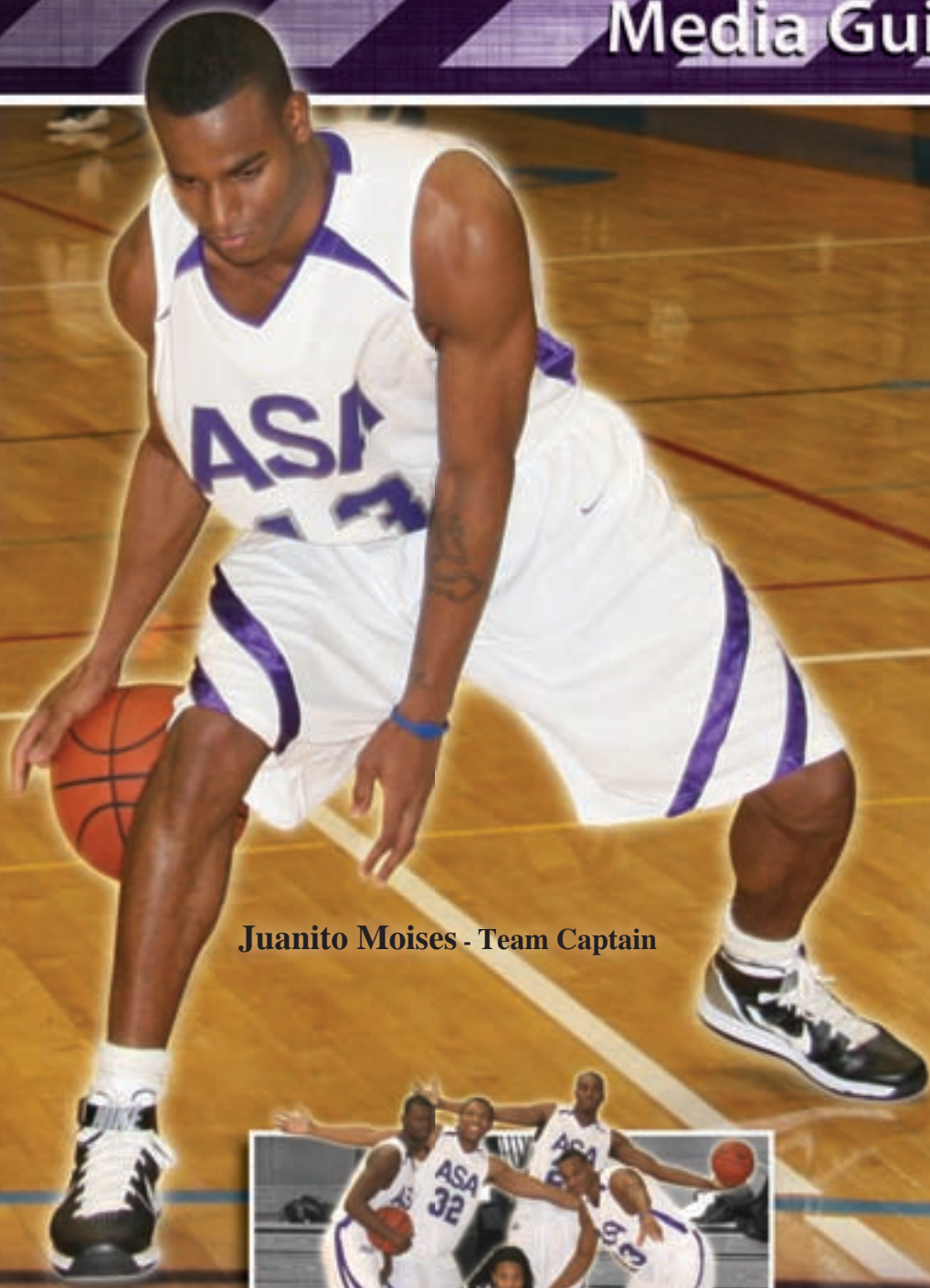

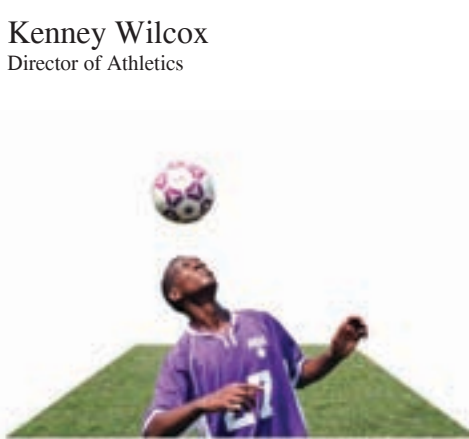

# About ASA - The College for Excellence

ASA's modest roots began in 1985 with a professor and 12 students in a small Brooklyn classroom. Known then as 'Advanced Software Analysis', the institute focused on computer programming, as New York had a dire shortage of qualified mainframe programmers at that time.

Since then, the college has grown to more than 5,000 students and 2 large, centrally-located campuses in midtown Manhattan and downtown Brooklyn. Today, in addition to computers, our programs focus on the rapidly-growing industries of healthcare, business and criminal justice.



Over the years, as technology revolutionized how every major industry operates, ASA created and updated programs of study to meet new market needs.

Consistent with the demands and capabilities of our student body, which includes highly motivated and mature immigrants, ASA programs have always featured a "hands-on" training component.



2010 marks the 25th Anniversary of ASA's existence. From its humble beginnings, ASA is now authorized by the New York State Board of Regents to confer

Associate of Occupational Studies and Associate in Applied Science degrees. The school's degree and certificate programs are registered by the State Education Department. Most recently, ASA has also been regionally accredited by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education.



# Academic Divisions

## Division of Business

ASA's Business Administration program integrates professional courses into the latest trends in business management. The Associate Degree programs combine theory with extensive computer applications so that students are prepared for both administrative and managerial positions within various types of organizations.

The curriculum is rounded out with general education and office technology courses and electives. It is through these courses that students are able to acquire a variety of intellectual and personal competencies that are generally perceived to characterize successful business managers.

## Sports Management Focus

Sports Management is an elective option under the Division of Business within the Office Administration and Technology major. The Sports Management focus is geared toward students who have interest in the different aspects of the business of sports including, but not limited to, athletic administration, coaching, sports marketing, athlete representation (sports agent), athletic health maintenance, and sports psychology. Currently, this elective option offers the following courses: Intro to Sports Management, Sports Marketing, and Sports Leadership.

## Division of Computer Technology

Computer Programming and Information Technology provide essential functions for almost all organizations worldwide. These systems demand a focus on the organization of computers, the theory which underlies their operation, and their applications. In using these systems, professionally trained programmers and network engineers serve in wide areas of business, at all levels of government, private sector, in public and social services establishments.

## Division of Criminal Justice

The A.A.S. degree program in Criminal Justice provides students with a broad-based, sophisticated understanding of the role of the criminal justice system in American Society. Students acquire the knowledge, values, and skills that will enable them to analyze rationally, the problems of the criminal justice system and the needs of society in a manner in keeping with democratic traditions of law, social well-being, and individual rights.

## Division of Health Disciplines

The Division of Health Disciplines offers a broad array of health related degree and certificate programs. The programs combine quality classroom and clinical instruction to provide graduates with the knowledge and skills necessary to work effectively as health professionals, who care for the sick, administer hospitals, attend to the pharmaceutical care needs of the public, and assist elderly or physically challenged individuals.

## Division of Arts and Sciences

Division of Arts and Sciences supports all of ASA's degree and certificate programs. It provides a wide range of general education and liberal arts courses. Remedial and ESL (English as a Second Language) courses are also administered through this Division.



# Academic Support Services

## ✓ Student & Academic Advisement

The overall objective of academic advising is to help students realize the maximum educational benefits available to them at ASA - the College for Excellence. Academic advising may include all aspects of academic program planning, including making decisions on adding, dropping, or substituting courses; career guidance; involvement in extra-curricular activities, etc. Academic advisors help students to understand their educational needs and aspirations as well as how to utilize the resources available at the college to help them achieve their goals. After the students register, advisors are assigned to them from the academic department where they are enrolled.

## ✓ Learning Center

The ASA Learning Centers offer students free, unlimited tutorials to help them reinforce and apply key concepts in their class work. This tutoring program plays a crucial role in ASA's strategy for providing students with the means to adequately prepare for employment. At the beginning of every semester, each Center posts a master schedule with the times tutors will be available for courses in every major field. Additional tutoring can also be arranged in any subject based upon individual student need. Prospective students may receive free ESL and math tutoring at the Learning Centers.

## ✓ Tutoring by Professor

At ASA you are not just another number, especially when it comes to giving students top notch academic support. This is why each academic department has designed a program where the professors will be available for extra tutoring during their office hours. The unique academic feature allows the student to be one-on-one with their professor for any extra help and guidance that they would want in order to maximize their success and understanding in that particular subject. The faculty at ASA truly wants their students to succeed!

## ✓ Writing Center

The Writing Center is an essential and vital part of the ASA community, where students are given the opportunity to learn in a seminar-style, innovative environment. It is dedicated to helping students cope with the challenges they face as college-level writers. The multi-media resources include computer workstations, and the latest in audio/visual equipment. The college's literary journal, "ASA Writer", is a semi-annual publication created under the aegis of the ASA Writing Center. The journal is a brilliant collection of writings produced from the experiences of a multicultural community of ASA students. Published authors, professional writers and scholars lead workshops and seminar discussions, which provide alternative forums for students to receive support in completing their writing assignments.

## ✓ Arthur J. Hidalgo Library

The ASA libraries actively support our student's efforts to be successful in reaching their academic and occupational objectives. The library collections are both physical and virtual, with over 14,000 physical volumes (books, multimedia items, journals, etc.), and almost 50,000 electronic books plus 38 electronic databases, all accessible through the ASA website, either on or off campus. All course textbooks are available for use in the libraries. The New York State Education Department, New York State Library and Board of Regents recognized the ASA libraries with the designation "Advanced Electronic Doorway Library". The ASA libraries are an Associate Member of the National Network of Libraries of Medicine, Mid Atlantic Region, and members of METRO, the Metropolitan New York Library Council. All library staff members are dedicated to helping students with their research and information needs.



# Student Life

## Residential Life

The ASA dormitory, located in the affluent area of Brooklyn Heights, houses the majority of the student-athletes at ASA. The five-story facility housing close to 100 students includes full bathrooms on each floor, study rooms, and a student lounge wired with Wi-Fi. The dorm is located only walking distance from the Brooklyn campus and is conveniently located near subway and bus lines, as well as the Long Island Railroad Terminal on Atlantic Avenue. Surrounded by a variety of shopping centers and cultural attractions, the building is steps away from the best view of Manhattan from Brooklyn along the Promenade. Other alternative housing options are available.

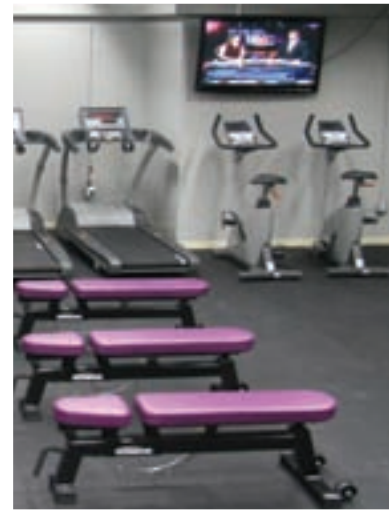
## Fitness Center

Completed in the fall of 2010, the ASA fitness center serves as a very important tool for student-athletes in and out of season. Every student-athlete now has access to the 1,100 square-foot training facility. The room is fully equipped with six platforms, four glute ham raises, two pull-downs, and a full set of chains, bands, dumbbells, and kettle bells, and cardio machines; other amenities include two large flat-screen televisions and a state-of-the-art stereo system. Conveniently located on the lower-level of the ASA dormitory, the fitness center is also outfitted with lockers and showers.

# Coaches Section



## Head Coach - Kenney Wilcox

*Ken Wilcox* enters his third season at the helm of the ASA men's basketball program. ASA men's basketball, the program Wilcox started, has achieved immediate success in the only two years of its existence thus far. In only its first season of existence for 2008-09, the program finished with a winning record and an appearance in the Region XV Division I title game. Last season, the team made huge strides finishing the year with a 22-6 record, including another Region XV Division I championship game appearance. To end the 2009-10 season, sophomore forward, Roberto Colonette, was named Region XV Division I Player of the Year.

Ken Wilcox is the first-ever Athletic Director and Men's Basketball coach at ASA, but he is no stranger to the daunting task of starting an athletic department from scratch. Previously, Coach Wilcox built a nationally recognized basketball program as a Coach and Athletic Director at Globe Institute of Technology. Coach Wilcox started the Globe Athletic Department back in 1998 with basketball as a club team. Over the past ten years, Coach Wilcox helped develop and grow 15 intercollegiate programs, with many teams being nationally ranked in the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA). As an athletic administrator, Coach Wilcox built the only Division I Junior College Athletic Department in the Northeast at the time.

While at Globe, Coach Wilcox built the Men's Basketball program into a nationally recognized program. The early success of the ASA men's basketball program has set the tone for even bigger and better results. In fact, in 2008-2009, under Coach Wilcox's guidance, the ASA men's basketball team was a finalist in the Region XV Division I Men's Basketball Championship Game in only the first year of existence. This tremendous first season accomplishment comes on the heels of his last season at Globe (2007-2008), when he coached the team to the Region XV Division I Men's Basketball Regular Season and Post Season Championships and helped guide them to the District III Championship Game.

Coach Wilcox garnered the 2007-2008 Region XV Coach of the Year along the way as well as winning the Regional Coach of the Year honors also in 2005-2006 and 2006-2007. Coach Wilcox's success in Region XV is also shown by six regular season or postseason Regional Championships in eight years, including a streak of five consecutive honors. In 2004-2005, Coach Wilcox led his team to 'Hutch', the NJCAA Division I National Championship Tournament in Hutchinson, KS, while earning District III Coach of the Year honors. That season solidified the Globe program he built from scratch as a national power.

Overall, Coach Wilcox has helped 26 former players move on to NCAA Division I programs, including student-athletes transferring to the Big East Conference, Conference USA, the Big 12 Conference and the Colonial Athletic Association. Over 50 players have moved on to four-year schools at other levels. He has coached six players that have received All-American honors by numerous magazines and athletic associations, including back-to-back NJCAA 2nd team All-Americans in Rob Robinson 06' and Jamual Warren 05'; Rob Robinson (Robert Morris) 2007, Jamual Warren (Cincinnati) Jamal Nichols (Depaul) in 2004,

Jimmie Inglis (Rutgers) in 2002 and Mike McKie (St. Peters) in 2001. Most recently, Wilcox and ASA have produced an NJCAA All-American already in Roberto Colonette who accepted a scholarship to play basketball for Manhattan College. Coach Wilcox has also coached one of the few junior college players that had been drafted to the NBA in Victor Sanikidze from the Republic of Georgia. He was drafted as the 42nd overall pick in the second round of the 2004 NBA Draft by the Atlanta Hawks.

He is the Recruiting Coordinator for the Men's Basketball program as well as being in charge of all the weight training and individual instruction.



### Assistant Coach - William Hill

**Coach Hill** enters his first season as an assistant coach to Ken Wilcox for the 2010-11 season. Hill comes to the Avengers after stints at the high school, junior college, and semi-professional levels. He will be an important asset to ASA as a recruiter especially in the upstate New York region where he has formed relationships with many of the high school programs. Coach Hill will assist in all aspects of coaching for the Avengers including recruiting, in-game coaching, practice preparation, and scouting opponents. Coach Hill will also serve as the Director of Intramural Sports at ASA.

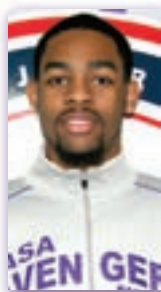

# ASA Men's Basketball Alumni

*Avenger Men's Basketball* is starting to create a buzz amongst coaches at the four-year college level. In the past three years, two players have already signed with NCAA Division I schools. One other former Avenger signed with a scholarship-level NCAA Division II school. Upon coming to ASA, the majority of the players are already receiving interest from scholarship level schools.

In the Spring of 2010, ASA sophomore forward, Roberto Colonette (Queens, NY) accepted a full athletic scholarship to continue his athletic and academic career at Division I Manhattan College that plays in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC). Colonette chose Manhattan over Hofstra and Iona. He is the first basketball ever from his high school to compete at the four-year level. As a sophomore at ASA, Colonette averaged 13.2 points per game, 8.5 rebounds per game, and 2.0 blocks per game. For his efforts, Colonette was named the Region XV-Division I Player of the Year and a National Junior College Athletic Conference (NJCAA) All-American. The 2009-10 team that he played on finished the season with a 22-6 overall record and a Region XV Division championship game appearance.

Former ASA shooting guard, Dishawn Bradshaw, is an Avengers' basketball pioneer. He was on Head Coach Ken Wilcox's first ever team at ASA for the 2008-09 season, and the first ever ASA student-athlete to receive a scholarship from an NCAA Division I school. He now plays and studies at the University of Maryland-Eastern Shore. So far this season at UMES, Bradshaw has started in all thirteen games, is second on the team in scoring (11.9ppg), is first in three-point field goals made (25), and second in three-point field goal percentage (35.2%). At ASA, Bradshaw was an All-Region XV selection, lead the team in scoring (21.0 ppg) and was second on the team in rebounding (4.75rpg).

# 2010-2011 Season Outlook

## 2009-2010 Season Recap

**The Avengers** finished their second season ever as program with an impressive 22-6 overall record. This a vast improvement from the 14-13 record in program's first year of existence. ASA would reach the Region XV Championship for the second time in two years.

The 2009-10 Avengers started off on a tear, going undefeated in their first 10 games. The Avengers first loss came against Globe on December 15th. However, ASA would avenge the loss by defeating Globe in the next two contests; once, on January 4th by the score of 88-67, and the second, in the Region 15 Division I Tournament semi-finals by the score 66-53. The Avengers' other extensive winning-streak came December 30 and January 27th where they would take 6 straight.

In terms of individual accolades, the team faired well in the selection process for post-season awards. Sophomore forward, **Roberto Colonette (Queens, NY/RFK)**, was voted Region XV Division I Player of the Year. Colonette ended the season averaging 13.2ppg , 8.5rpg, and 2bpg. His consistent play and character on and off of the basketball court earned him the honor. Joining Colonette on one of the All-Region teams was sophomore guard, **Garel Craig (Hackensack, NJ/Hackensack)**, who was voted to the second-team. Craig finished the season leading the Avengers in scoring with 16.2ppg and in assists with 4 per game. He had a season high in points against Nia Prep, including (4) 3-point field goals.



## 2010-11 Season Outlook

**The Avengers** will have a brand new look for 2010-11 season with only one player returning from last season's squad. Sophomore guard, **Juanito Moises (New York, NY)**, is the only returner from last season's 22-6 team. Moises will be called on as leader on and off the court. In last season's Region XV Division I championship game, he demonstrated his qualities as a leader by scoring a poised fifteen and pulling down seven rebounds. He will be joined this season by a talented group of young local guards such as freshmen **Jamal Francis (Brooklyn, NY)** and **Omar St.-John (Queens, NY)**. Coach Wilcox will also welcome a standout transfer in **Allan Thomas (Queens, NY)**. To round out the back-court are freshman point guard, **Sa'Quan Davis (Washington D.C.)**, and freshman off-guards, **Mickey Davis (Syracuse, NY)** and **Lamont Middleton, Jr. (Harlem, NY)**. Upfront, Avengers have made some improvements with 6-11 transfer sophomores, **Kevin Briggs (Providence, RI)** and transfer 6-7 banger, **Wayne Allison (Brooklyn, NY)**. Briggs and Allison will be joined by 6-6 athletic swing-man, **Keenan Belle (Brooklyn, NY)**. Belle, a transfer from upstate Broome CC, averaged 15.54 ppg (team leader) and a little over ten rebounds per game last season for the Hornets.

ASA will open the season on a trip up to Boston where they will take part in the Roxbury CC Tip-Off Tournament. After playing local Bronx CC on 11/16, the Avengers will go back on the road down south to play Northern Virginia and Montgomery-Rockville. ASA's first Division I match-up of the season will come against Harcum College on 11/30 in Pennsylvania. The Avengers will go back down to Maryland for the Cecil Holiday Tournament where they take on Lackawanna on the first night. On 12/21 the Avengers will begin Region XV competition against Globe. After the winter recess, the Avengers will host Region XV rival, Monroe College, which will be a rematch of last year's Region XV Division I championship game. The team will round out their regional schedule with a home and home with Westchester CC.

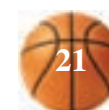
